Whether you want to fill one or many vacancies, Jobcentre Plus has a wide range of services to take the hassle out of recruitment. Free to use and with no red tape, they tailor their service to help you fill your vacancies with the right people. They will advise you on the local labour market, plan for recruitment, advertise your vacancies and sift or match appropriate candidates. They may also be able to arrange a Work Trial - a risk-free way of trying out a potential employee at no cost to you.

If you would rather manage your own vacancy, Employer Direct Online is a free service which allows you to register, check, update and remove your vacancies online easily and conveniently. Your vacancies will appear on a recruitment website, receiving more than two million visits a week, as well as on Jobcentre Plus' national network of touch screen terminals.

Recruitment Subsidy

Jobcentre Plus is currently offering a £1,000 subsidy to employers when they recruit a person who has been claiming Jobseeker's Allowance for six months. For more information about the £1000 per person Recruitment Subsidy visit www.businesslink.gov.uk/advertiseajob

Work Trials

Work Trials offer employers a risk-free way of trying out a potential employee for up to 30 days at no cost to the business. The jobseeker stays on their normal benefits during the trial - and also gets the opportunity to make sure the job is right for them, before accepting any job offer made. Redundancy Support

Jobcentre Plus operates a Rapid Response Service (RRS) for employers so that, if the worst happens and you are forced to consider redundancies, there is help on hand to co-ordinate a tailored package of services to best support your affected employees. RRS help is available to jobseekers from the point when they are under threat of redundancy, up to 13 weeks after they lose their job.

Employer Direct Online

Employer Direct online is a free service from Jobcentre Plus that allows you to post your jobs online without having to speak to an adviser. The key benefits of Employer Direct online for your business is ease of use - you can advertise your vacancy straight from your computer, you can post your jobs on the UK's most visited recruitment website, it is free to use and gives you round-the-clock access.

Because Jobcentre Plus is part of the European Employment Services (EURES) network, vacancies can also be advertised across Europe. EURES links public employment services in those countries that are members of the European Economic Area. It helps people to move freely and take up work in other member states, so it can be used by companies that haven't found the right people locally or nationally.

Encouraging Diversity

Jobcentre Plus' network of Disability Employment Advisers can help you to recruit and retain people with disabilities and a range of practical support and funding is available. The Access to Work programme helps with the extra costs of employing staff with a disability or health condition and the Job Introduction Scheme can offer a grant of £75 a week to employers recruiting a disabled person to help with wages and other costs during the first few weeks of work.

Local Employment Partnerships (LEPs)

Longer-term relationships with Jobcentre Plus can be forged through LEPs - a scheme where government and employers work together to tap into the potential of local communities. These partnerships lead to effective recruitment and help bolster communities, resulting in better business relationships for the employer. Many employers across the country have already signed up to LEPs, with the aim of opening up job opportunities to disadvantaged jobseekers - a source of talent and potential that often remains untapped.
